Fire Safety information - Delayed Evacuation



This scheme has been identified as having a 'Delayed Evacuation' Policy following the annual Fire Risk Assessment that has been carried out.

If you are not directly affected by a fire you should delay your evacuation and remain in your flat unless you are told otherwise.

What to do if there is a fire:

A fire in your flat:

- Leave the room where the fire is straight away and close the door if it is safe to do so
- Tell everyone in your home and get them to leave immediately, close the door of the flat behind you
- Do not stay behind to put the fire out
- When safe call the Fire Service on 999
- Wait outside, away from the building, at the designated Fire Assembly Point.

If you see or hear a fire in another part of the building:

- Your building is designed to contain a fire in the flat where it starts, this means it
 will usually be safe for you to stay in your own flat, if the fire is elsewhere
- However, you must leave immediately if smoke or heat affects your home, or if you are told to leave by the Fire Service
- If you have any concerns or worries and if it is safe to do so, you should get out of the building
- If there is a need to evacuate the building the Fire Service will normally instruct this
- If you are in a communal area of the scheme, wait outside at the Fire Assembly Point until you are told it is safe to go back inside.
